- 4. Keep all phases positive and upbeat.
- 5. Utilize the Event Master Checklist and refer to it often.
- 6. Conduct a very special ALL SCHOOL AWARDS ASSEMBLY. Invite Board Members, District Office personnel and parents.
- 7. Provide the consultants pictures, quotes and other information within one week after the Awards Assembly.
- 8. Evaluate the AASC using the prescribed form.
- 9. Market the event utilizing a variety of products and ideas.
- 10. Place the date on your school calendar early.
