**David Morehead Event Director, AASC** Physical Education Teacher Pixley Middle School

Q: What grades did the All-American Student Classic feature?

**A:** Grades 6. 7 and 8.

Q: How many students participated in the Classic?

A: 67...a number of students expressed to me that they did not take part in it, but want to do it next year.

Q: What is your overall feeling about this event?

A: It is an awesome experience for the kids. They took the academics very seriously.

Q: What event of the ten did the students enjoy most?

**A:** The obstacle course.

Q: Why the obstacle course?

**A:** The variety of the seven obstacles and its challenging competition.

Q: What three words would you use to describe the AASC?

A: Challenging, competitive and exciting.

Q: What benefits does a student and school derive from sponsoring the AASC?

**A:** There is a common theme. It brings students together for a week of fun and activities. It also helps change the school culture and provides a very positive school climate. I also observed students who normally don't participate an opportunity to take part in the various activities.
